As Founding Administrator and later Chief Operating Officer of Wright Graduate University for the Realization of Human Potential, Ms. Sudarsan led the University through its state approval, launch, initial accreditation, Title IV authorization, transition to primarily distance learning, and later accreditation by DEAC.



While responsible for university operations and compliance Ms. Sudarsan also developed programs and curriculum, led training seminars, facilitated learning laboratories, and provided individual coaching for the Wright Foundation's non-credit leadership development programs. She has served as an Educational Standards Evaluator for DEAC since 2021.
